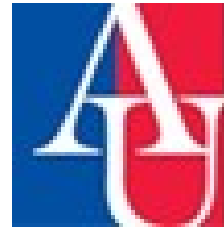

- Evaluation and Monitoring

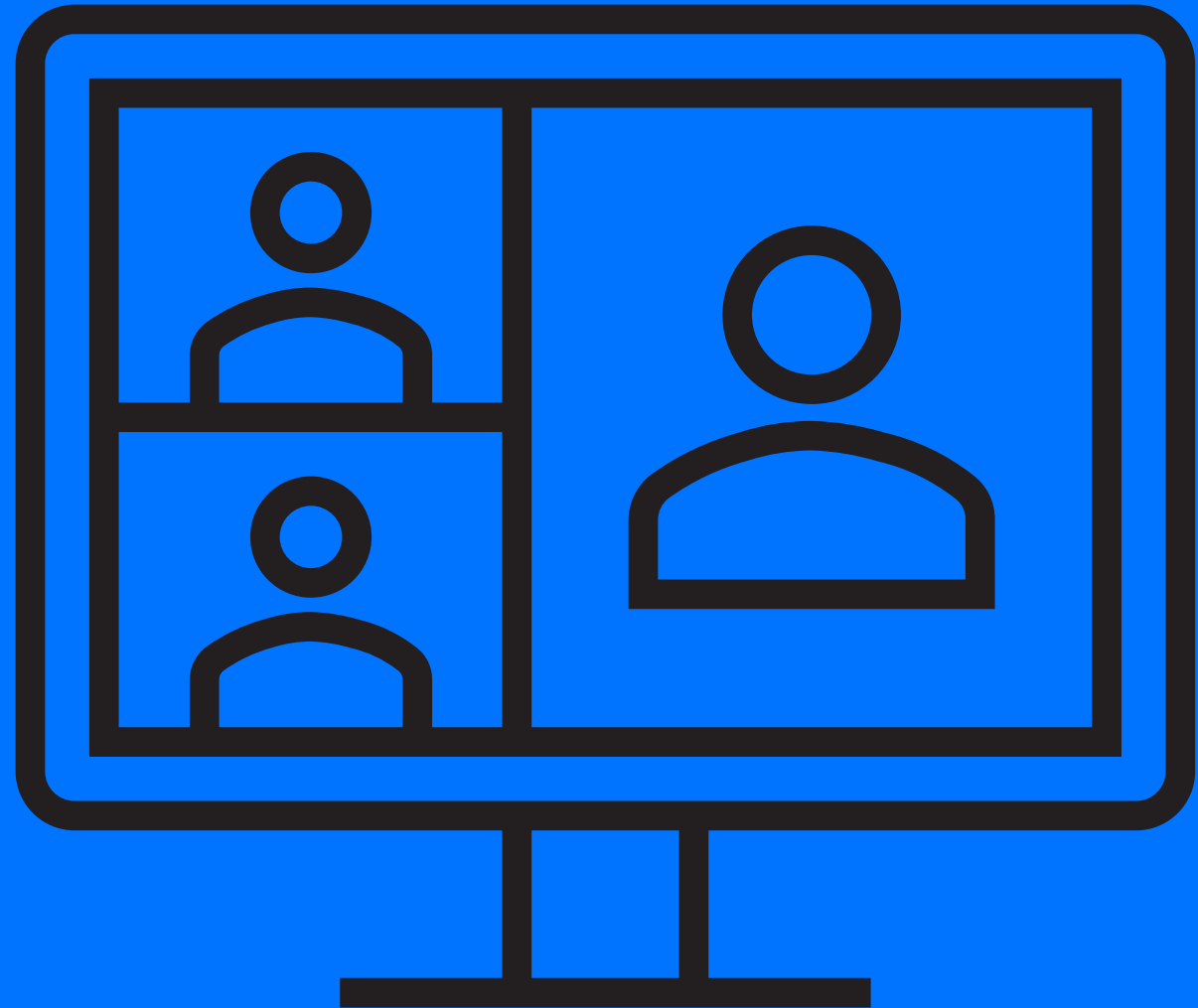

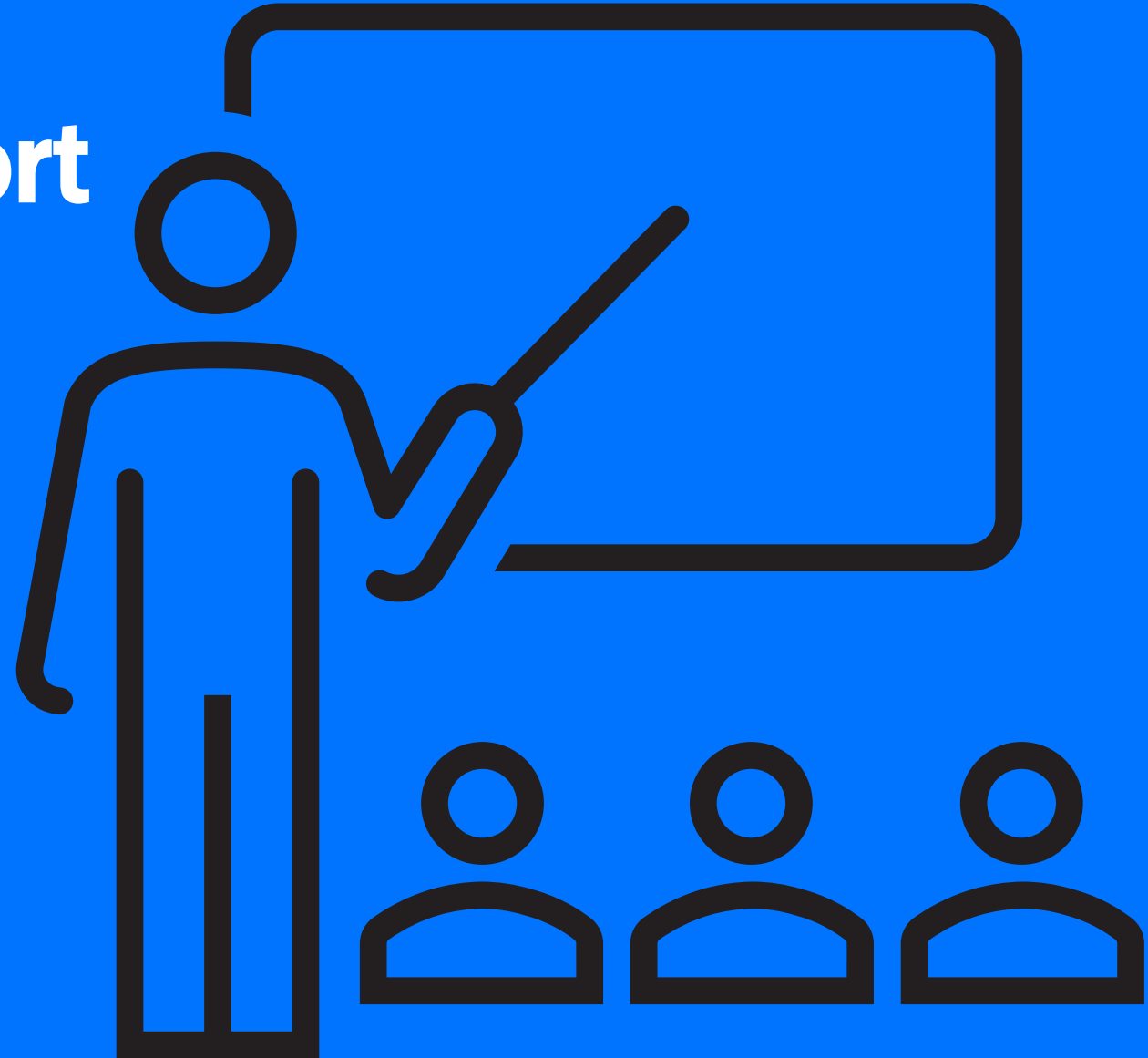
