Treatment courts, like drug courts and veterans treatment courts, are on the frontlines of America's drug and crime epidemic. They provide a proven, cost-effective solution for reducing crime and preventing overdose deaths. Investment in these programs must continue to help state and local leaders increase their capacity to address the substance use disorder crisis while breaking the cycle of addiction and crime.

By combining personal accountability with responsibility, treatment courts transform individuals who drain system resources into productive, working, tax-paying citizens. A U.S. Department of Justice study confirmed drug courts reduce crime by up to 58% and save an average \$6,000 per participant. Additional benefits include increases in employment, education, family functioning, and financial stability.
