What is SBIRT?

Screening, brief intervention, and referral to treatment (SBIRT) is a public health approach designed to identify individuals at risk for substance use disorder (SUD), including first-time impaired drivers. It involves a three-step process:

- Screening: Identifying individuals who may be at risk for SUD and/or impaired driving
- **2. Brief intervention:** Providing tailored feedback and support to address identified risks and promote behavior change
- **3. Referral to treatment:** Connecting individuals to specialized care for SUD

SBIRT and Impaired Driving

Impaired driving is a serious public safety and public health concern that disproportionately contributes to crashes, injuries, and fatalities. SBIRT provides a valuable tool to address this issue.

- **Early detection:** Identifying impaired drivers with SUD before they continue to put themselves and others in danger
- Promoting safe driving: Encouraging individuals to make safer driving choices, such as abstaining from driving after consuming alcohol or drugs
- Addressing underlying issues:
 Identifying individuals with SUD and providing access to treatment and support services

Practical Implementation

Screening

- **Tools:** Standardized questionnaires, such as the AUDIT or DAST
- **Settings:** Courts, law enforcement, treatment courts, community organizations
- **Examples:** Screening for alcohol and drug use at arrest, court appearances, traffic stops

Brief Intervention

- Strategies: Motivational Interviewing, education about the risks of impaired driving, SUD treatment, behavioral interventions
- Focus: Increasing awareness of the dangers of impaired driving, presence of SUD or risky substance use, assess readiness to change, providing support to change behaviors
- **Examples:** Providing brief advice and resources to at-risk individuals identified during screening, encouraging them to use transportation alternatives, referring them to treatment resources

Referral to Treatment

- **Purpose:** Connecting individuals with specialized services to address SUD
- **Examples:** Referring individuals to treatment programs, treatment court, other interventions to meet their needs
