



Supporting Reentry Success for Individuals With Mental Health and Substance Use Treatment Needs

Evidence-based practices for successful community reentry

Individuals released from prison or jail face numerous challenges, particularly when they also struggle with substance use or mental health disorders. Too often, these individuals enter a tragic cycle of crime and imprisonment. Through evidence-based reentry practices, jurisdictions can create opportunities for successful community integration, easing system costs and improving long-term outcomes for formerly incarcerated individuals and their communities.

The Challenge

Local jails across the country book an average of seven million individuals every year, and an additional one million are incarcerated annually in state prisons. Whether confined pending trial, serving a short sentence in a local jail, or held for years in a state prison, more than 95% of those in custody will be released back to the community. Of those, more than half, around four million people, have a substance use or mental health disorder requiring treatment. Without appropriate support, these individuals face significantly higher rates of reoffending and early death, particularly due to increased suicide and overdose risk. Research consistently shows that jurisdictions can interrupt these cycles of crime and improve long-term recovery rates by following a set of strategies that create strong partnerships between justice and behavioral health professionals.

The Solution

Our Approach

The Center for Advancing Justice has developed the AIRS framework (Assess, Implement, Review, and Sustain) to facilitate our work with local jurisdictions.

Assess: We begin with a comprehensive system assessment to evaluate a jurisdiction's readiness to implement evidence-based reentry practices. Through stakeholder interviews, data analysis, and resource mapping, we help jurisdictions understand reentry practices, existing resources, and current reentry service gaps.

Implement: After the assessment phase, we work alongside local leaders to craft a jurisdiction-specific implementation plan that leverages existing resources and partnerships. We help develop policies and procedures, train partners, create communication plans to facilitate interagency information sharing, and develop referral pathways to rapidly connect defendants to the new services.

Review: As jurisdictions begin to implement improved reentry processes, we provide real-time support to help evaluate impact, gather feedback, and make necessary adjustments.

Sustain: To ensure that changes last beyond the initial implementation period, we support sustainability planning, including long-term funding strategies, staff training plans, cross-system coordination protocols, and the identification of internal champions who will lead ongoing efforts to support system goals.
